Kairos. God's time.

A powerful retreat centered on community, prayer, reflection, and shared witness.



Do NDA seniors still go on Kairos retreats?

This is one of the most common questions alumnae ask — and the answer is a resounding yes.

Since the early 1990s, NDA seniors have participated in Kairos, a powerful retreat centered on community, prayer, reflection, and shared witness. Kairos, a Greek word meaning “God’s time,” invites seniors to grow spiritually and personally as they prepare for life beyond high school.

In recent years, Kairos has been led by seniors enrolled in NDA’s Catholic Leadership Seminar, a theology elective.

Uniquely, these student leaders guide the retreat without having previously attended Kairos themselves — experiencing it alongside their classmates for the first time.

“We experience it together,” shares **Hayden Johnson ’26**, “which makes leading our classmates especially meaningful.”

Payton Shively ’26 adds that this shared experience fosters honesty and vulnerability, strengthening relationships.

For **Julia Chryst ’26**, the retreat models servant leadership through humility and connection.

Kaitlyn Morrow ’26 was moved by the depth of relationships formed through shared witness talks, while

Abby Beier ’26 found the experience most powerful in “seeing God in my classmates, especially those whose lives may not look like mine.”

Kairos continues to be a defining, faith-filled experience for NDA seniors — one that brings the class closer together at a pivotal moment in their journey.

Isabel Nester '21 discovered servant leadership through mentorship—both receiving it and offering it. As she pursues a career in medicine, Isabel is driven by service at the intersection of science and compassion. “The harder your leaders and mentors work, the more successful the whole team becomes,” she shares. As a first-generation medical student, she now mentors younger students, carrying forward the support she once received.

Her sister, **Julia Nester '23**, leads by putting others first—creating inclusive spaces where people feel valued. “NDA shaped how I think about leadership,” Julia says. “It’s not about being in charge, but helping others grow.” She draws inspiration from Christ’s humility and carries that mindset into daily life.



Erin Dixon '95, managing director at Golden Seeds, shifted from real estate development to angel investing to support women-led companies. She credits NDA with instilling collaboration and integrity. “It’s one thing to have a seat at the table, but another to have a voice,” Erin reflects. “NDA gives young women the foundation to use that voice.”



Bonnie-Jean Chudzinski '93, a Catholic educator for more than 25 years, servant leadership means steady presence and quiet service. “True leadership is measured not by authority, but by willingness to serve,” she says — a lesson shaped by formative service experiences at NDA.



Wendi Huntley '83, President & CEO of Connecting Kids to Meals, leads by example — working alongside her team to serve the community. Her understanding of servant leadership was shaped by the Sisters of Notre Dame, athletics, and a belief that no task is beneath a leader.

The sky's the limit.

"I have just one more requirement to fulfill – a solo, cross-country flight of 150 nautical miles," she shares.

Rhiannon's parents are behind her all the way. "Although my mom has said to me – you just learned to drive, and now you're flying," she laughs.

Already, Rhiannon has completed a three-month ground school course, taken flight lessons, and even flown her first solo flight. Her goal is to complete the multi-hour test to earn her pilot's license in January 2026, a full four months before she graduates from NDA.

"I've always been somewhat of an adrenaline junkie, and I've always wanted to travel," says Rhiannon. "Flying combines the two for me."

Although she's well on her way to earning her pilot's license, Rhiannon plans to attend Bowling Green State University after graduation from NDA, continuing her education in the BGSU School of Aviation. Her ultimate goal is to become an Airline Transport Pilot and work for a major airline.

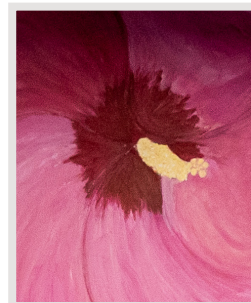

Regina serves as a Museum Educator at the Toledo Museum of Art, where she manages the Family Center – a free, interactive art studio and play space designed to engage children and their caregivers in hands-on creative exploration.

Leaders in Athletics & Life!

NDA's SportsLeader program integrates Catholic virtues into athletics, inspiring NDA athletes and coaches to grow in their faith through weekly activities, team retreats, and meaningful ceremonies.

NDA launched SportsLeader in 2016, and remains the only school in northwest Ohio to offer this unique program.

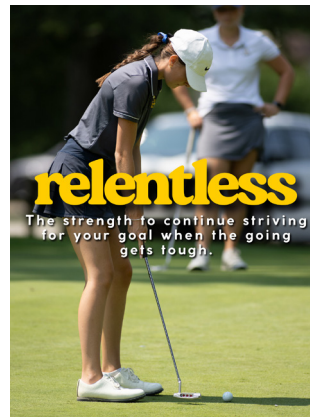
"SportsLeader is such a powerful program," shares **Samantha Moscinski '17**, assistant athletic director at NDA. "It encourages our student-athletes to become leaders and also teaches them about Catholic virtues."

Each week, a different virtue is shared with coaches and athletes, and the teams decide how to incorporate that virtue into their practices and competitions. Virtues such as, "Generous," "Relentless," "Heroic," and "Considerate," provide opportunities for reflection and introspection.

Stephanie Egan, NDA's head cross country and track & field coach, loves how SportsLeader reminds the athletes, "that they are blessed to be able to do the sport we love with one another and our faith," she shares.

Coach Stephanie incorporates the weekly virtue to allow the athletes to put their faith into action in their sport.

"I choose [student] leaders each week, and they read the prayer of the week and challenge their teammates to embody that virtue," she explains. "This can be done through discussion, journaling, or highlighting something a teammate did to represent that virtue."



"It provides an opportunity for them to recognize each other for the little things they do and reminds us all that it's bigger than the sport. It's about working together in a faith-filled team to accomplish a common goal."

In the SportsLeader program, every season begins with a retreat, where athletes learn about their faith and the virtues, as well as meet other girls on their teams, and begin to develop relationships with one another.

Toward the end of each season, a moving Letter Ceremony is celebrated by each team. During the Letter Ceremony, each athlete reads aloud a personal letter to her mother, and is read a letter from her father, with her entire team there to support her and witness the occasion.

"Listening to the girls as they share, and let themselves be a little vulnerable, has a very strong impact on them," explains Samantha. "It can surprise them, in good and positive ways."

A night full of tropical smiles and lasting memories! Our NDA fathers and daughters danced the night away at this year's Luau-themed Father Daughter Dance.

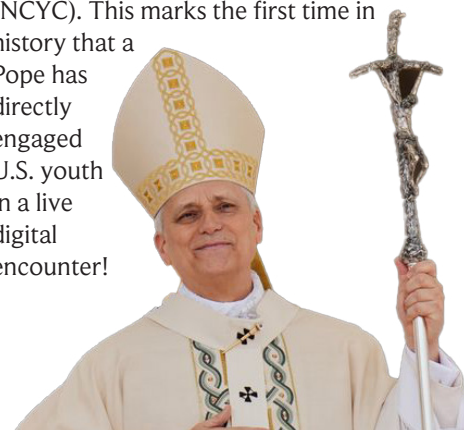
Celebrating 175 Years

“I often go to gigs and see people I know from college or grad school or past performances, but I’ve never seen someone from high school. It was so exciting!”

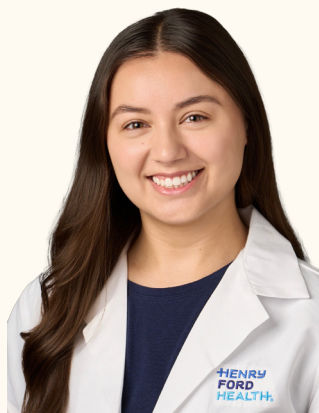

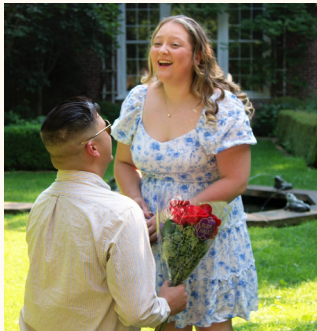
